Do you remember where you were April 10th, 2010? Yes, it was a long time ago. That is the day I came to live at the Ozark-Dale County Humane Society no-kill shelter. I am the dog who has been here the longest. My name is Ms. Mac and this is my story.

I was two months old when I arrived at the shelter. I had a serious case of mange. It was one of the worst cases they had seen at the shelter. The progress I made was amazing! I stayed strong and made it through a rough beginning as a little puppy, then, began the wait for my "fur-ever" family.

The shelter is nice, but it is the only home I have ever known. I do not know what it is like to have my own human family or to have a bed in which to sleep. I do not know how it is to be snuggled. I came here as a puppy, grew into a young dog, and now I am a full-grown dog. I have seen many other dogs come and go over the years. Sometimes I wonder why I am still here. It could be that my shyness comes across as disinterest. That is not so. Most likely due to my harsh beginning, I just have to feel as if I can trust you before I am comfortable. I am 5 years old now. (Some say that is 35 to us dogs.) There are days I worry I may never be that special girl for someone. But I saw my friend, Fleck, get adopted after he was here for over 5 years. I heard he is doing really well. That keeps hope alive for me. I want to give my love to someone who loves me. I am clean, I walk really well on my leash and I am a really nice girl. I just need for you to come and take me home. I am a survivor and will not stop believing that the family I am meant to be a part of will be coming to get me soon. Do you think it could be your family?


